TASK LIST - 2023

- 1. Feeds equines using special diets and supplements (such as hay, pellets, pills, and powders) as instructed by the veterinarian and recommends dietary changes and supplements as necessary in order to sustain an equine's nutritional needs.
- 2. Cleans and disinfects various workspaces and equipment of the equine facility/barn(such as stalls, enclosures, laundry facilities, feeders, and waterers) in order to maintain the cleanliness and organization of the work environment.
- 3. Loads and unloads equines; operates tractors; cleans and organizes transport vehicles in order to ensure that equines are moved from one location to another in an efficient and safe manner.
- 4. Observes and reports on equine behavior and conditions for health, illness, and other signs reflecting their well-being (such as colic and/or other signs of distress) in order to sustain the equines' quality of life.
- 5. Oversees and administers medical treatment of equines as directed by a veterinarian (such as the treatment of sick and injured equines and the removal of injured equines from enclosures and stalls) in order to properly care for the equines.
- 6. Checks for and corrects public misconduct on the grounds, such as entering restricted areas and/or preventing volunteers from having direct contact with the equines, in order to ensure that the equine facility is secure.
- 7. Cleans and repairs all equestrian tools and equipment (such as saddles, bridles, and equine stalls) using common hand tools (such as screwdrivers, wrenches, and pliers) in order to maintain the condition of equipment and equine facility.
- 8. Trains and oversees new Equine Keepers in the performance of duties such as equine care and facility maintenance, in order to ensure completion of tasks in an efficient and effective manner.
- 9. Oversees court-referred volunteer workers in the performance of duties such as stall cleaning, transport vehicle cleaning, and facility grounds upkeep, in order to maintain cleanliness of the facility and vehicles.
